For the past five years, Des Moines Christian School has enjoyed the many blessings of our 26 acre campus, located in the beautiful Timberline neighborhood of western Urbandale. Construction of the facility was carried out with a practical approach to provide the space necessary for near-term priorities, fully expecting the need for expansion in the future.

At this time, we are close to reaching capacity in the current facilities, as the building is in use from early morning until late in the evening. With essentially four schools (Early Education, Elementary, Junior High, and Senior High) sharing the common spaces, the scheduling of athletic practices and game times has become a serious challenge.

Several critical issues need to be addressed to accommodate the continued growth of the school:


- The Early Education department has waiting lists and no more rooms available.
- Major events in the gymnasium, such as music concerts, eliminate its use for physical education for a day or more, and varsity teams have had to practice in rented facilities to accommodate other activities.
- Due to the building's constant use, we regularly turn away other organizations which request to rent our facility, thus losing revenue.



 Our football/soccer field is neither lighted nor adequately developed for competition. We are required to pay rent for neighboring facilities for football games and track meets.




The Board of Directors has identified opportunities for the academic, spiritual and community advancement of Des Moines Christian School, and the

- Lunch is served from mid-morning until mid-afternoon in the current Multi-Purpose Room, unless displaced by a science fair or art fair, which requires students to carry meals to their classrooms.
- As part of the capital campaign, the school is committed to accelerated debt reduction.



Multi – Purpose Facility with New Early Education Center:

Relocating the Early Education department to a new building on the east end of the current facility will free up the current space for growth in the elementary and secondary departments. A dedicated entry/ exit point will increase the safety and efficiency to accommodate our youngest students. In addition:


- Elementary/Jr. High gymnasium One gym floor capable of being separated into two courts to provide concurrent athletic activities for junior high students and elementary PE classes.
- Stage for both drama and music performances
- Scenery construction and storage
- Restrooms to provide support for school activities, athletics, and performances
- Office space to improve efficiency and effectiveness in our administrative work
- Kitchen to serve snacks/lunch to the Early Education students, refreshments after performances, and athletic concessions

Stadium Complex Set on the west end of our property to house track, football, and soccer, and provide improved community access for exercise use.

- Artificial turf field for year-round use with minimal maintenance.
- Eight-lane all-weather track and field events facilities for long jump, high jump, discus, etc.
 - Support buildings to provide locker rooms, weight room, equipment storage, concessions, score board, and a press box
 - Bleachers to seat 1,000-1,500 people
 - Lights for all athletic fields
 - Irrigation on athletic fields and green areas
 - Gymnasium modifications to improve safety and functionality
- Security cameras to cover the new multi-purpose building, parking lot and new field areas
